Do you remember our beautifull oranges, all night long panels, and parties on the yards? Yes???

Please come here and remind us of, because we almost forgot about "the days". So, if you ask "what's up with zachodnia yard?" I will answer "yes it's ok, if you like to speak with security or SOK guys!" How this is possible? Hmmm... the situation dramaticaly changed since the last year. That's when the train company started to buff trains throughout Poland taking care about this monsters a little more than they used to. Still it seems that crews like HTP, DTB96, KFC, TNA, RTN, TCF are smarter than their enemies and don't give a fuck leaving their marks on trains. But every month the situation gets harder. Security forced writers to visit lay-ups around Warsaw, which sometimes are totally fucked up as well! But if you succeed you might be sure that your piece will run through the city one, maybe two or three times, but not longer than two days for sure. If you want to paint it, you have to hurry because in the next 2 years no more orange colour commuters will run in Warsaw. All the tracks go underground. No stations are above ground level, it's a 100% subway. Every station has SOM (special subway security) and police who stay there all day (and night) long, equipped with guns and stuff like that. So if you would like to, try make it on your own and be aware that most of the bravest ended in security or police headquarters. Subway security got definitely better skills than commuters security, but the writers got the best of 'em all ;-) There are some lucky local guys and tourists who can be proud of having a picture of panels on it, but the subway company is prepared for more damage in they area for sure;) If you will successfully join the lucky ones, the subway company will be "enjoyed" so much, that they will keep it for themselves and do everything to prevent people to know what you can do at night when the city sleeps.

About 15 years ago I read a book by George Orwell called Animal Farm. It was about a bunch of animals living at Mr Jones farm. After a while they'd had enough of his sorry alcoholic abusive ass and started a philosophy called animalism. Their aim was for all the animals to be equal but some of the animals outsmarted the rest and slowly took over. The book is full of metaphors and satire on communism and fascism, it pretty much describes George Orwells thoughts about the developement in the Soviet Union during the 1930-s, but it can also be read as a story for kids about animal rights.

Several years later I got in touch with Animal Farm crew from Belgium for the first time. I'm running an online trainsite, Eyegasm (look for the fast acces link on this page) and they started to send flicks. The AF always sent in big, colourfull productions and the message of their pieces was clear - do not eat animals!

I decided to have a chat with the AF crew about their styles and their political stands to see if their crewname has anything to do with the book wearing the same name.

E: What about your name Animal Farm, is it conected to the book by George Orwell?

AF: Obviously. If you've read the book or know what it's about, you know what the crew name stands for. There is so much meaning and actuality in this story and it is to be read in many ways. That is already a nice thing for a Graff name. It creates the possibility to add something Graff often lacks: a subject. And somehow everything is Animal/ Manor Farm. All human systems and groups. All animalism. Some are more equal than others. And while

Orwell used the farm as a metaphor for communism, to us it stands for the failure of the entire capitalistic world and the perversion of power. On the other hand; we are writing around a concept, but that is it. Some don't want to be seen as a concept on itself. It remains graffiti. Young boys vandalizing.

E: You sometimes write "meat is murder" and other 'animal rights activists slogans'. Is Animal Farm a concept or is it a way of life?

AF:We don't think the eating of meat is the main subject. That is more of a personal matter. Some of us do, some don't, some didn't, and some won't. And that is good. It would be stupid to ask within a bunch of friends to hold on to an ethic code. Then we too start a farm in the wrong way. It is more a matter of respect towards other living creatures. Most of us aren't against eating meat, but against the misbehavior towards beasts and natural rich Dom. We are surely the ugliest and weakest animals existing except for the sea cucumber, but became almighty in spoiling everything given to us. So, yes we would accept meat eaters in our crew if they ritually slaughter a lamb, crown up in peace and freedom, every week.

E: Is graffiti the right media/ way to express yourself?

AF: Some writers in the crew are a bit fed up with the empty headed Graff, and prefer to add little politics to it. But we don't paint exclusively to make a statement. All of us already paint before the crew Animal Farm existed. We just grouped some writing friends together, with different beliefs. United forces. Some of us can't imagine graffiti without message, others just like the name. We are well aware, though, that graffiti isn't the right forum to express such matters. If you make an Antifascist piece, we'll probably create more Nazis than solve world problems. But it is good fun. Small side thinking: It is not so easy to talk about Graff. Most of us (writers) have difficulties answering question about Graff. It is something to be seen and done. Opinions and ideas change fast.

E: What about your styles? According to me you keep it simple and playful but still very funky and fresh...

AF: Now that's family affairs. The styles are different but influence each other a lot, like in any Graff team. Off course, we are also influenced by other writers, graphics and by the places we visit. Varying from dead birds in Kemzeke to Keggr tags in Kobenhavn

E: A few years ago you put up your own names more than the crewname, (atleast that's what it seemed like to me) these days you do alot of Animal pieces, how come?

AF: We put up a lot of animals pieces, because

then we work on a stronger thing. And it 's cool for the others if someone does a panel or piece somewhere else. There 's already enough egotrip. We like to do lots of différent shit. Putting the same piece up a thousand times on a different color of steel gets boring after a while.



E: You have travelled alot. What do you think about the scene in other european countries?

AF: Going on tour is superfine. Some of us really like travelling. Getting to know a new system, seeing other people, having less stress, being focused on painting. The contact between writers is a special thing. It is beautiful; the efforts that get done for someone you know for 10 minutes. Just out of love for the scene you're in. It's cool to hang around all day like a bump and get trashed of painting. It is a cool way to get to the point of a place. You come in places and atmospheres that you'd otherwise never discovered. It is very direct. It is like a long and fascinating play, which is never borring.

E: Nowadays graffiti is a big business with lots of products available on the market. How do you think that has affected graffitiwriting?

AF: The buissnessthing is double. Sellout works. The forum got worldwide, more people are interested and nowadays you're able to reach thousands of people. That's cool. Some are even able to make a living out of it. Either directly or indirectly, by getting fame. But then again. Maybe Graff isn't meant for that. One

of it's most beautiful aspects is that it is illegal, and thus by your own initiative, methods and meanings. F***ing marketing wankers are trying to sell the soul of an underground movement, as they did with punk etc. before. Clothes with wrong pieces, all type of merchandising and gadgets, computer games. Even Coca-Cola and MTV make graffiti orientated publicity. Unfortunately they twist things against them in such way that they can make profit out of it. It's sad; regarding that way we all work on a revolutionary commercial for the giants.

But the good thing is that real graffiti can't be sold. Unlike punks, you can't just pretend to be a graffiti writer. Either you go out at night and paint, or you don't. Graffiti is not a homogeneous culture; it groups people of all sorts, ages and beliefs, with different looks and interests, but shared actions and deeds. And those can't be faked. Another thing Next thought of is that by sponsoring writers with cans, you change that basic of own motivation. Normally it is just toys, painters and a few kings. But by sponsoring you get 'pro's' and 'amateurs'. Then the paint factory starts choosing who's up and not. Off course we too would like to paint for free, but it makes the

scene a dirty economical thing and rips the soul out of it.

E: Famous last words?

AF: Shoutouts to; George Orwell, The man; Shoc, TV, Elite, God, Acide, Taj, Fashion, Zen, Dm, Teras, CLK, Fra 32, The Groningen Boys, Rolling Stoned, Sand, Temp, Roots, Cash, NMBS, Constant Cocks, IBD, Veel dank aan alle papas en mamas, broers en zussen: we zien jullie graag! GULP, Dikke Troela's, Loes, Dunia, en bovenal al onze vrienden en vriendinnen (beter geen namen), dikke smakkers voor onze prinsessen, and hi to anyone whom we had a good time with.

Introducing...

Pubes One, AKM and TPG crews. Pubes: In about 1988-89 I was writing my name on my school books, not trying to graff. Then I noticed pieces in my area, I also saw throw ups on my line by an old school Brisbane crew PCP. I couldn't figure out how to make letters look like that, but wanted to try. Sometime in 1990 I went to the royal show by train, and saw a piece I still clearly remember to this day. It was aqua and purple and it said ROMEO (I later found out it was by KASINO). Me and some guys from school started a crew and practiced on the local coal trains. Then in 1991 I took a bone white and a black and did my first electric train.

B. Australia is sort of isolated from the rest of the world, do you think that has had any effect on the AU Graff scene?

Pubes: Like everywhere in the mid 8o's when the whole hip hop movement swept the world, styles were set. Australia's styles may have developed different, but so did most countries. People had contact, and we received limited info and magazines from the U.S and Europe (I think I got my first bomber in 92 or 93). America was as influential as Europe back then too, but we seem to follow Europe more now. We have been effected a little by our isolation, but not much, but it doesn't matter, cause we held it down for ourselves regardless.

B. Can you think of any major differences you even might have experienced during your trips in Europe?

Pubes: Tunnels and 3rd rails, our electricity is all over heads. As for tunnels, we only have a few lay-ups underground across the whole of oz. So for me they are non-stop action, a whole new experience. But great fun!

B. Since it's isolated, does that make the urge to travel even bigger? Is that why some aussies seem to travel a lot?

Pubes: No probably less, it's not like popping across the border to Belgium from holland for a change. To go from Brisbane to sydney is like popping from Holland to Milan for a change, quite a difference, and Melbourne is double that. Because Brisbane has always been hard we travelled to the other oz cities looking for something better. Overall oz is quite hard now to paint trains, so a lot of guys are out looking for something better, or just wanna have fun, all over the world. We are like the spaniards here, you'll always hear there is one in your city causing trouble.

B. I've watched The Crocodile Hunter on TV, Steve Irwin makes Australia look like one big death-trap with spiders, scorpions and snakes. Are your painting missions like a scene from Indiana Jones?

Pubes: Nearly all yards are suburban, or semisuburban, so you don't have to deal with any animals that are too crazy. But on a night out you will end up walking through a spider web or two. I took a European guest out in oz one night and he walked into a web.

Well the spider is as big as the palm of you're

hand, isn't poisonous, but very ugly. It's web is strong like silk, but sticks to you. He was scared as hell and started spazzing out, when we had to be quiet. I thought it was quite funny, cause I knew the spider would be more scared of him and run away.

B. You got Montanas pretty late in Australia, did you use local brands before that? Was visiting Europe your first acquaintance with European paint brands?

Pubes: Yeah, we never really had outside paint.

We had a bit of Marabu, then Krylon came,
then Belton R.A.L. Now it's pretty much every
brand in Europe. But until I left I still never used

B. How is the public opinion and the media's attitude regarding graffiti in Australia?

Pubes: It is disliked all over oz. The way it should be, it's a crime.

it, that shit is like 14 or 15 australian dollars a can, and I ain't paying that... Me and most guys I know mixed our own paint. We have a semi decent brand called Dulux which has a fat cap system. Then we fill it with line marking paint (upside down can, for marking the ground). It makes the paint super thick and semi-matte for quick drying. Also you can end up with original fresh colours.

B. Do you still mix your own colours or did you fall into the warm, bed spread called Montana (or is it a rather cold amnesia?)

Pubes: I have definitely jumped in that bed, but i am still figuring out what colours are good. I had to start from scratch to learn what is thick and what is watery. I still think our mixed paint is much better.... At home it's necessary for free or cheap fat cap paint. Here the price is more reasonable, but i have done it here for the drying quality. A tube in winter is like painting on wet glass.

B. Australia got an overall oldschoolstyle, especially compared to Europe. You broke that barrier at an early stage, how come?

Pubes: I have always observed graffiti from everywhere and to me the 70's and 80's held the be styles. But a lot of the stuff I did, and still do, is under 10 minutes, so it has to be simple. So I ended up with a style people in oz called European, but to me it's a development of N.Y. styles.

Later on KASINO was an influence too. With having similar ideas about what was good graff. Without trying he pushed me in the right direction with things I never cared about, but really helped me to developed the angle I was on.

B. Is there a conflict between those who do oldschoolstyle and those who have evolved and gone further?

Pubes: a few years ago maybe so, when there wasn't much style variation, and you were dissed if it was out of the norm. But graffiti is really open and now there is so much input from different sources. Most of which I think is arty shit. But also every city is going to have it's purists, and good on them, each to there own. There are only a couple of guys who I would even half listen to about my style in oz, the rest don't matter.

B. How is your 'newschoolstyle' received back home?

Pubes: Most people are down with it for sure but I don't care really anyway, I am trying to make graffiti I like.

B. What do you think of the attention for the Australian scene in the european Graff media?

Pubes: As long as the same photos of my pieces aren't being sent to two different mags it's cool... oz should be shown, it's the best country in the world.

B. OZ should be shown, true, but it's in their hands, then again, why's Australia the best country in the world...?

Pubes: Of course home is where the heart is, everyone should be proud of where they are from.We have the weather, the beaches,the whole life style is great, i can't really explain it.

Most people who travel there love it. I really appreciate it so much more being away from it. But I like to travel and really see places, like meeting some locals and seeing the grimey underbelly of that city. It's real life, not just looking at a tourist attraction where every-

one would go. As for me being in London, there are loads of aussies here. Being a British Colony it's easy for us, all we have to do is prove we have some money and a 2 or 4 year working visa is on the way.

B. Why are you writing on trains?

Pubes: I really don't know, I question myself all the time, but really can't figure it.

B. Do you still feel what you felt during your first trainactions? Is the magic we were bewitched by after Style wars still there?

Pubes: No not at all. When I painted my first passenger train my knees were knocking, then when I painted my first sydney train, which was my tenth train, they started knocking again. CASE 2 in no way comes into my head when I am cutting double layers of cage on a tube yard. It's strictly business. Access each situation, and figure the best options.

B. Is the adrenaline still worth the risk?

Pubes: I don't think I would be here still if not.

B. If it wasn't for trains would you still be in the game?

Pubes: Possibly so, I have to do pieces and work on ideas I have. Doing backjumps you can't really get too loose, so if i have to paint a wall to get loose, I gotta do it. But if I can practice those ideas on a train, of course I don't need to paint walls. I haven't painted a piece on a wall in London yet

In Europe I have done a lot of things I wanted to do, from indoor to outdoor, undergound, above ground, emergency brakes, to yards where no body is coming till the train leaves on monday, everything changes with the crossing of a border, sometimes quite dramatically too. It's weird the cities are so close but completely different with there security measures... got to take it as it comes. Usually the help of some locals can save you a lot of time figuring something out for your self, and thanks to the guys who did help me out, with food, beer and Graff.

B. How active are you on the trains and what drives you to them?

Pubes: I am as active as my life style lets me. It's real life I'm an adult, the bill's have to be paid, there is a real world out there I have to try take part in. My main motivation is others painting trains. Friend or foe. I think "fuck it, if they can do it, so can I".

B. Do you feel more freedom during painting in European yards then in Australian yards?

Pubes: No not really, the fact of the matter is, you can get arrested, no matter where you are. Maybe you are a little more anonymous, but more photos and info are only an internet search away. Although a search on my name will probably end up with a million porn sites. The British Transport Police have a good graffiti database too. So everything in London isn't

anonymous for me anymore.

B. What is a King in your definition?

Pubes: This is a question with so many answers and views. But one of the things I really admire is older guys who never went legal, and kept at it. Trains or illegal pieces,or just wrecking shit. Guys like SICK WCA from Melbourne or TENSE 73A from Adelaide. Both around long before me, are still here, and I hope in years to come I can see those nigguz on the street... a lot of older guys have come back out of the wood work now, it's great to see these guy's reppin' again.... but they should never have gone away.

B. What has the future has in store for you?

Pubes: Eat good food and stay alive.





What's Yo Name Fool?





were not good to write. I stopped and threw all drawings away; it was time to listen to some "true norwegian Black Metal". After some minutes of hellish sound I heared "Grim" in a song. Ohh yes! It was perfect. Since that day I have been using the name Grim and still it's great to go to a concert and listen with onehundred other Black Metal idiots to these lyrics. When I meet my buddies from LF-MS crew after a concert is was the best to bomb a train, or to do some shit in the streets. But they can't understand why I listen to this music, hahaha. Grim is not only a name for me, I am Grim.



I'am always trying to find cool words that nobody is painting yet, one time I was watching tv and someone called some other dewd a nitwit (nit-wit: a stupid or silly person) and I liked the word immediately so started to do some sketches with that word. I didn't really like the letters that much but I did like the name so I just had to try to get it to work. Also 6 letters can be a bit long but I found some ways to deal with

I have this name since 98 and I don't see myself taking a new name in the near future I still like it too much and I like to stick with the name even when I run out of new ideas what can be frustrating sometimes, but usually I come up with some new shit after a while.




I started writing "Mask" in 97. At the beginning it was one of my undercover names but in 2000 I got caught with my main name, so I took Mask instead. Well, I started writing a lot of different words first, trying others letters all the time. For some reason I always liked the letters S, so I started using that a lot, then the rest just fell into place. I liked the way these letters look together and it's a good bomb name cause it's a simple word which has only four letters. Now after six years of traveling and bombing it everywhere, I can really say that this name became mine. I still enjoy doing other letters, but for me nothing beats bombing another Same piece!






